OUR IMPACT

Where it All Started...

The first Boys & Girls Club in Wichita opened in 1990 at the "Oaklawn" Club. In 2007, the Club expanded its presence in NE Wichita opening the Clubhouse on Opportunity Drive. In September 2020, the Club added the Chautauqua site in partnership with Holy Savior Catholic Academy. The Board continued to have a vision of growth so in March 2022, the Club added two sites at the Intermediate Schools in partnership with the Maize School District. In August 2022, the Club expanded to four additional sites in Maize and six new sites in Emporia. Most recently, in August 2023, the Club opened three new sites in partnership with the Derby School District.





YOUTH OF THE YEAR


The Youth of the Year (YOY) title is a prestigious honor bestowed upon an exemplary young person in recognition of leadership, service, academic excellence, and dedication to live a healthy lifestyle. In order to compete, candidates must be at least 14 years old, a member for more than two years, write three essays, be involved in the community, interview with a panel of judges, and prepare a 3-5 min speech.

Khaai's Story

"Born as a crack baby," a child born with drugs actively in their system, Khaai was put into foster care. Two years later, he was "reborn into Khaai," as he was adopted into a new family. In school, Khaai felt like an outsider, and he didn't feel like himself- UNTIL he joined the Club!

"It's impossible to go unnoticed here- for once, people knew who I was. Throughout the years, the Club continued to mold me and develop me as a leader... I began to grow into my own, and I no longer felt the need to be someone else," says Khaai.

Khaai went on to win the state title, and he even competed in Regionals! As the Kansas YOY, Khaai has served as an ambassador for all teens in the state and he has recieved over \$10,000 in college scholarships from Boys & Girls Clubs of America.

Summer 2023 Recap






